
I believe in the Holy Spirit A child responds to a request with a pleading voice, "I can't." A frustrated, grumpy sounding adult retorts, "Can't or won't?" Can't implies that one is not able to fulfill the request because of lack of knowledge, skill, etc. Won't implies a willful choice to not cooperate. Two

very different reasons for not fulfilling a request.

Martin Luther begins his explanation of the Third Article of the Apostles Creed with these words: "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel...

Can't or won't?

Well, the bottom line answer is that we cannot confess Christ Jesus as Lord because Adam and Eve would not obey God. Their willful disobedience set the



pattern of how we relate to God. We are by nature disobedient towards God. Left to our devices, we will always try to save ourselves in a way that will not

In God's boundless kindness, Jesus saves us through his sacrificial death on the cross. And, it requires the Holy Spirit working faith in our hearts and minds in order to believe, trust, confess that Jesus Christ is my Lord.

God knows all of our excuses. He knows all the reasons for either "can't or won't." He chooses to by-pass our inadequacies and ill-will entirely and give us faith as a gift.

LDR ready, responsive to Harvey

Even as Hurricane Harvey, one of the most powerful storms to hit the United States in years, made landfall Aug. 25,

threatening millions in Texas and Louisiana with heavy rain, wind and rising tides, Lutheran Disaster Relief



was prepared to respond.

Rev. Daniel Rift, director of ELCA's world hunger and disaster appeal, issued a call for gifts designated to "Hurricane Response: United States" with the assurance that the response to Harvey will not be completed until the disaster survivors have recovered and rebuilt.'

Rift noted that the National Hurricane Center predicted that the storm's effects

would be "life-threatening, devastating and catastrophic" and would be followed with long periods of rain and flooding, along with massive power outages. "While many have evacuated, significant damage is still expected, and thousands of people may be housed in shelters for extended periods of time," he added.

"We have an opportunity to accompany our neighbors during and after this disaster, in Jesus Christ's name," he pointed out in an email message to congregations. "Your gifts are needed now to help those affected by Hurricane Harvey."

Gloria Dei members and friends can contribute by placing checks or money, designated for Hurricane Response, in the Sunday collection plate. Every dollar is immediately forwarded to the ELCA.
