Wednesday services resume with Lent, which begins Feb. 14. Ash Wednesday, both the noon and 6:30 p.m.

The theme of the Wednesdays in Lent will be *Imprinting the Image* using Psalm 119. Noon services will be spoken. 6:30 p.m. services will be sung.

During the Sundays in Lent we will use ELW 811

On My Heart Imprint Your Image as the gospel acclamation. This is a worthy prayer for your Lenten devotions: On my heart imprint your image, blessed Jesus, king of grace, that life's troubles nor its pleasures ever may your work erase. Let the clear inscription be: Jesus, crucified for me, is my life, my hope's foundation, all my glory and salvation!

Bible study is working through the *By Heart* Small Catechism book. In Lent we will change our meeting time from 10 a.m. to 10:30. We will not have a study on Ash Wednesday.

Here is a prayer for Lent based on Psalm 51.

In the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.
Lord, have mercy.

I cry to you, O Lord, Let my prayer come before you.

Let my mouth be filled with your praise, and with your glory all day long.

Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit.


Help me, O Lord, this day, to live without sin.

BOF payoff moves ahead of schedule

Good news from the Jan. 21 annual meeting, included the belief that because of the support of members and an upswing in the use of scrip, the Building on Faith obligation may be paid off months ahead of the June, 2020 scheduled termination.

It was also noted that 100% of pledges made in 2017 were filled and that a five-

figure general fund deficit in midyear was reduced by nearly two-thirds thanks to generous giving toward the end of the year.

Reports from other committees and organizations were received and the voting members elected Jack Seifer, Dan Lindborg and Nikole Oliver-Scherer to second three-terms and John Miller as nominating committee chair for 2018.

Thelma died Jan. 13 in Iowa, where she moved a few years ago to be closer to family. She was a longtime member of Gloria Dei, an active member of the Ruth Circle, a lector, and a past president of WELCA. Most importantly, she was a witness to her faith and her church simply by welcoming all with a bright smile and warm greeting.

Thelma defied her numerical age and remained active well into her 90s. especially participating in and teaching line dancing at the Battell Center and as a past member of the Red Hat Society.



Souper Bowl collection to aid local charities


On Feb. 4, Big Game day (we do not want Roger Goodell swooping down on us), our Sunday School boys and girls again will collect
